The purpose of high school graduation requirements is to establish rigorous standards of learning that will enable all Al Ittihad National Private school students to meet the vision of the school. All Al Ittihad National Private school graduates will:

Possess the attitudes, knowledge, and skills necessary to contribute positively and compete in a global society; exercise the rights and responsibilities of active members in society; and pursue post-secondary education and/or careers without need for remediation.

As Grade 10 students move into Grades 11 and 12, at INPS – Abu Dhabi courses are offered that will help them stream-line their academic choices to support their career options and university course of study, where:

- 1. Elective courses are offered to give our students strong background and foundation in both Science and Business streams.
- 2. At the end of Grade 10, students choose their preferences and commit to these choices for the next 2 academic years (Grade 11 and Grade 12).
- 3. A grace period of two weeks is given at the commencement of the academic year of Grade 11 for students to assess the validity of their choice.
- 4. Students of Grade 10 indicate their preference by choosing (v) from the table below.
- 5. Compulsory subjects: Islamic / Arabic / English / Math / ICT and Economics.

Graduation Requirements

As part of the graduation requirements in Grade 12, students must meet Abu Dhabi Education Council criteria to pass grade 12, i.e. attaining at the minimum passing grade in all subjects.



Graduation Requirements

- All graduates must seek "UAE Equivalency" status for their Higher School
 Diploma .University certificates (BA or B.Sc.) will not be attested by the Ministry
 of Higher Education in Abu Dhabi without the High School Diploma Equivalency.
- Graduation clearance is conducted when the student has completed all of the required and elective subjects, received final evaluations and passed all the final examinations, in compliance of the American requirements, and Abu Dhabi Education Council.
- Students must sit for ADEC administered final exams in Arabic and Islamic and pass with 60% minimum. Additionally, students must pass all school exams with a minimum of 60%.
- In order to fulfil the American Diploma requirement, Students must pass either TOEFL with 62 or IELTS with a band of 5.5 and must pass the SAT I with 400 in the Math section.
- After all requirements has been successfully completed and evaluated, the administrative office will review the academic records and forward a recommendation for graduation to the Abu Dhabi Education Council.
- While these administrative procedures are taking place, the school official formally informs parents of their role in terms of equalization and authentication of all relevant documents.
- After both academic and financial clearances have been completed by a designated school official, the school assigns an official graduation date.
- Students must submit university acceptance form and any new contact details as part of our alumni association.
- A graduation ceremony will be conducted to all grade 12 students at the end of the academic year.
